

# ERIE GIVES RAISES \$4,471,123 THE COLLECTIVE POWER OF MANY PEOPLE

On Aug. 14, 2018, The Erie Community Foundation hosted the 8th Annual Erie Gives. Two hundred sixty-four generous donors helped The Playhouse raise \$76,463.47. Wow!

A special thank you to The Erie Community Foundation for sponsoring this event, and to The Erie Community Foundation, GE Transportation, Erie Insurance, Presque Isle Downs & Casino, Northwest Savings Bank, McInnes Rolled Rings, E. 
# ANNUAL ERIE GIVES CONTRIBUTIONS

# FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE

# **REVENUE FALLS SHORT OF GOALS**

Financially, the year presented some unexpected challenges. Some revenue goals were not met (annual fund drive, CANDIDE collaboration with the Erie Philharmonic, staging JACK AND THE BEANSTALK offsite) and we incurred unexpected renovation costs. Even though production expenses were managed in a way that minimized the effects to the bottom line, we still ended the year with an \$82,440 deficit. However, we are poised for future success.





# PLAYTIME PRE-K PROGRAM

- Since 2015, 622 students have participated in over 1,000 Classroom visits to date, each running 25-30 minutes in length.
- Each session begins and ends with a song, created especially for PLAYtime, as a creative way of maintaining cohesion between sessions.
- A new book is featured each week from United Way's Imagination Library.
- Each book is featured twice by reading it aloud and by utilizing dramatic play, music, and art to actively involve the children in the story.

# **PLAYTIME MUSICAL**

- Since 2015, we have presented 15 free performances of PLAYtime musicals based on Imagination Library books: MY LUCKY DAY, ONE COOL FRIEND, and THE LITTLE ENGINE THAT COULD.
- Approximately 3,400 children and their families have attended shows free of charge, with half of them also participating in special Parent & Me sessions offered in conjunction with the musicals.
- In addition to the PLAYtime musical, over 3,000 students & families from all the PLAYtime learning centers, as well as United Way Imagination Library families, attended the Youtheatre musicals, many of them attending a live theatrical performance for the first time.

# **PLAYtime stories:**

Each week we leave a storybook behind, placed ever so carefully in the classroom library. Last week the teacher asked, "Any chance I could get two copies for my room? The stories you read are the first off the shelf every time! We've had to start a waiting list!"

"PLAYtime is their favorite time of day, even my non-English speaking children understand the stories when you add in all the drama and music!"

"I know Halloween is over, but can't we do "The Spooky Walk" again!"

During that time students devised a storyline, created a script, and performed it on the LECOM stage for family, friends and staff of Sarah Reed and the Playhouse. Funded by Schuster ReGrant.
